




#### Race

 Race is a created thing in our minds, that is often realized in our actions.






## We are taught to sort


## We learn what to value/prefer




# Our minds are created to make connections

...Yet we internalize them






# Let's talk about a common race-based education connection

#### Did you know...?



- Race is connected to poverty
- Poverty is connected to income
- •Communities are formed by families/individuals who earn similar incomes
- Schools are funded by property taxes
- Urban schools primarily serve
   Black and brown students

#### Family Engagement Involves Being Responsive

#### Hillard City School District

- 8.3% of students are Black and 2% of staff are Black
- "We're late and as a society and as a country, we waited too long...we need to do differently and immediately put some actions into place." Dr. Marchhausen
- Created a Task Force

#### Living in Denial, Ohio...

- "I live in a rural community. We don't have race issues".
- "I live in a diverse suburb, our student population is 25% Black".
- "We don't have race issues in our school, its predominately Black".
- "I work in communities and with districts who seem to be doing well addressing race".

- Psychological stress


